WHAT'S THIS ACTIVITY ABOUT?

Create a cover for:
"The Most Valuable Book in the World"

WHAT STUFF DO I NEED?

Paper and something to write and draw with!

In the story "The Not-So-Safe Safe", by a 12 year-old from Michigan named Ellary, we learn about the Valuable Book Museum, from where the Most Valuable Book in the World is stolen. This got us wondering: what is the Most Valuable Book in the World, and why is it so valuable?



Is it a nonfiction book with tips on how to make money? Or a book of treasure maps you can use to find hidden riches? Or a how-to book on mining diamonds??



Maybe there's something special about the book itself? Will a genie come out and grant you wishes if you open it? Is the cover made of solid gold? Does the book turn into a spaceship if you read a certain sentence inside it aloud??



Maybe it's just a story SO entertaining that EVERYBODY wants to read it? What would the most entertaining story ever written be about? What would it be called?

We want to hear what you think! Draw a picture of the Most Valuable Book in the World. Is it a nonfiction book that will help you get rich? Or is there something unusual about the book itself? Or is it just the greatest story ever?? Be sure to include the following:

- ✓ Give it a title! Don't just call it "Most Valuable Book" --brainstorm your own title from your own imagination.
- ✓ Draw a colorful picture that shows us something about the book.
- ✓ Some books include a blurb, or "teaser" that tells you a little bit of what the book is about. Write a sentence or two that says a little more about what you would read inside.
- ✓ Say the author's name. It could be your name...or a completely made up author!
- ✓ If there's something special about the book (like being made of gold...or a genie hiding inside), draw and label that part as well.

BONUS: if you do all that and still want an extra challenge, then start actually writing the book! Draw those treasure maps! Or give us tips on mining diamonds! Or write the most entertaining story of all time!
